2 points for each member, parent, advisor, per event, for attendance at Junior Fair events such as: Fair Fun Event, Cloverbud Days at the fair, King/Queen contest, fair opening event, Pickaway Livestock Judging Contest, Jr. Fair Night. (do not include Jr. Fair Board members or royalty candidates.) List member and event:

Junior Fair Royalty Contest: 5 points for each member who competes in a Jr. Fair Royalty Contest including King/Queen, Princess, or Equine. List members:	20	
Educational Programs & Clinics: 2 points for each member, per event, for attendance at educational programs and clinics outside of the local club but in county. Examples: Open House, project clinics, livestock clinics, clothing workshops, officer training, teen awards, etc. List member and event:	30	
District & State 4-H Events: 5 points per member, per event, for participation beyond the county level. Examples: Ohio State Fair, judging contests, clinics, state Jr. Swine Day, collegiate 4-H activities, SPIN clubs. List member and event:

5 points for each member selected to attend a state or national 4-H trip. List member and event:	30	

Volunteer Education: 5 points for each volunteer who attended a 4-H educational event such as Ohio 4-H Conference, Club Kick-Off, New Advisor Orientation, etc. List volunteer and event:

Volunteer Committees: 5 points for each volunteer who serves on a county or state committee serving the 4-H program, such as 4-H Advisory Committee, 4-H Judging Team, Horse Advisor Group, State Volunteer Conference Planning Committee, etc. List volunteer and committee:

Volunteer Service: 5 points for each volunteer (advisor, parent or teen) per event, for their service. Examples are county skillathon, Open House, county Quality Assurance, assisting with county judging, assisting with Open House or a 4-H county project clinic, etc. List volunteer and event:

Educational 4-H Club Tour: Club tour conducted. This does not include tour of members' homes or farms to see member projects. Examples are: businesses, factories, medical facilities. List what and where:	20

Donations: 5 points for each organization or cause where a monetary donation is made by the club. Examples: sponsor awards, donation to location where club meetings are held, non-profit/service organizations such as Heart Association, Leukemia fund, donation to 4-H Committee, 4-H Endowment or Fairgrounds Revitalization. These must be documented in the treasurer's records submitted to the Extension Office. List donations:
