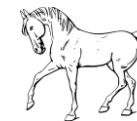




SO YOU ARE TAKING A HORSE PROJECT

A FEW THINGS TO KNOW:

- ❖ The Horse project books can be complicated. Most need a new book each year. All but 174 needs a separate record book. #174 is a three-year book but has very specific instructions on its completion. Be sure to read the section above for your project.
- ❖ Members wishing to take 182 Small Equine must first complete at least one year of 174 Beginning Horse Management first.
- ❖ All members wishing to exhibit at The Ohio State Fair must first qualify at a PAS (Performance Against a Standard) Show. One PAS opportunity will take place on the last day of fair. No horses may be trailered in for this event.

- ❖ Pickaway County has a 4-H Horse Key Leader who assists with 4-H educational events. In addition, a 4-H Horse meeting takes place in January, March, May and September. All advisors, parents and members are welcome!
- ❖ Registration packets are mailed to all horse exhibitors in by April 1. All forms must be completed and returned by May 1.
- ❖ Stalls – all horses must be stalled at the fairgrounds for the entire fair. Stall assignments will be available the week prior to fair. Horses arrive on Saturday of fair between 2:00-9:00 pm. **All horses must be stalled before 9:00 pm.** Barn check-in will take place as you arrive. Horses may not leave until Sunday after the fair between 6:00-10:00 am.
- ❖ All horses and ponies must have a Body Condition Score (BCS) of a least a 4 to be exhibited in 4-H or Jr Fair events.
- ❖ Measurement cards – all ponies and small horses must be measured.
- ❖ Helmet rule – all 4-H members participating in any 4-H or Junior Fair activity must wear a properly fitted and secured, approved helmet at all times.
- ❖ It is recommended that a parent/adult be present whenever a youth is practicing in the arena.
- ❖ The Pavilion (horse arena), is utilized for shows other than horses. The arena is closed for set up prior to the start of these shows. Please be courteous in sharing the facilities.
- ❖ Read your fairbook! Pay special attention to the Junior Fair rules and horse show rules.
- ❖ Junior Fair Horse shows take place three days of fair. As of November 2020 this is tentatively set for Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday.
